

# **CLC211 Chinese Language in Singapore from Social Perspectives (社会视角下的新加坡华语)**

## **Synopsis:**

CLC211 studies the use of the Chinese language in Singapore from social perspectives, with particular reference to Mainland China, Taiwan and Hong Kong. Linguistic phenomena, characteristics, and development of the varieties of Chinese used in these countries are examined. Students will gain a better understanding of the relationship between language and society, and the linguistic and social factors affecting the use of the Chinese language as a communicative tool in society.

- The relationship between language evolution and social evolution
- Overview of the Chinese language in Singapore
- Characteristics of the Chinese language in Singapore
- The relationship between the Chinese language in Singapore and in China, Hong Kong and Taiwan
- Differences in vocabulary between the Chinese language in Singapore and in China, Hong Kong and Taiwan
- The influence of the Chinese dialects, English and Malay on the Chinese language in Singapore
- Unique regional new words in the Chinese language in Singapore
- “Same words but different meaning and same meaning but different words”: Difference between the Chinese Language in Singapore and in other Chinese-speaking regions
- Differences between the grammar of the Chinese language in Singapore and modern standard Chinese language grammar
- The impact of language policies on the Chinese language in Singapore
- The current situation and prospects of Chinese language in Singapore
