Synopsis:

MTH355 Basic Mathematical Optimization will provide undergraduates with an understanding of the common algorithms used in linear optimization. The topics covered are of central importance for many applications in data science and data analytics. The course gives a comprehensive introduction to the simplex method and integer programming whilst only assuming a knowledge of basic linear algebra. Additionally, the course will teach students how such algorithms are implemented using the software Gurobi.
