Synopsis:

Advanced Clinical Practice II: Family Intervention addresses married couples and families specifically emphasising the family life cycle. It contrasts major models of family assessment and treatment relevant to contemporary family systems. Special attention is given to the multi-systemic context and to engaging diverse families. Students will become proficient in using the family need framework to direct their choice of models for assessment and intervention with diverse families in a variety of practice settings. The family practice builds upon the theoretical framework of systems theory in combination with various theories including structural, strategic, solution-focused, experiential and other modern therapies.
